Betty worked on build sites for quite a number of years, as she said, "hammeringnails" before deciding that it was time to shift her efforts into our office.

Betty understands the importance of a stable, decent homefor every family. She recognizes the value of volunteers, partnerfamilies, donors and others coming together to build simple, energy efficient, high quality homes. Betty has seen the positive impact we have onneighborhoods, when a hard working family has the opportunity to purchase thehome they helped build, at a price they can afford, with a zero interestmortgage.

Every Wednesday when Betty is done with her "work" for theday, she says, "See you next week - weather permitting." We are thrilledand grateful that Betty continues to share the life she is making with HabitatCFC. Happy Birthday, Betty! We hope to have you here every Wednesday foranother 30 years – weather permitting!

## 12th Women Build House Dedicated to Rosanna Dotel and her Family

In January we dedicated **Habitat CFC's 12th Women Build house** to **Rosanna Dotel** and her three children.

The 12th Women Build home is also in honor of longtime Habitat CFC core volunteer Beverly Eckert. Beverly's husband was killed on September 11, 2001. Following his death, Beverly channeled her pain and anguish into helping others and serving her community. In 2009, Beverly and several other 9/11 family members met with President Obama to advocate for airline safety. Just a few days later, she was killed in a plane crash. Beverly is remembered not only as a 9/11 widow but as a selfless and irreplaceable Habitat volunteer.

The family will move into their new home on Davenport Street in just a few weeks. "I am excited to become a Habitat CFC homeowner and especially proud to be buying the 12th Women Build home that has been built in Beverly Eckert's honor," said Rosanna.

Matt's goal over the next nine months is to map out the many stepsthat go into creating an affordable home ownership opportunity and help thestaff identify possible ways to streamline processes, eliminate duplicateefforts and hopefully shorten the time it takes to acquire properties, buildhomes, select partner families, secure funding, educate homeowners, recruit and schedule volunteers, and every other step leading to a home sale. "We alreadyknow that Habitat CFC builds quality homes and has a track record of homeownersuccess. But when all the pieces of the organization fit together and areoperating as efficiently as possible, it will be easier for Habitat CFC tobuild even more homes for hard-working, low-income families," said Matt.


